Lauren Bonner, Assistant Dean of Students at Loyola Academy, shared information about the Crisis Response Network of the North Shore (CRN). The CRN is a group of over 85 professionals from approximately 47 different agencies who meet monthly to share insights, discuss current trends and network with other professionals within the community. The CRN was started to help the communities of New Trier and Northfield Townships with counseling services during a crisis. Some of the call-outs the team has handled includes: providing counseling services following the sudden death of a student, providing support to staff and students after teacher passed away following a long illness, and providing support and information to the community following multiple suicides during one summer break.

In addition to providing counseling services, the CRN has hosted trainings programs including active shooter, student behavioral threat assessment and a yearly adolescent health summit.

Although many of the call-outs have involved schools, the CRN is available to assist organizations or businesses in the community. To activate the CRN, contact Julie Fleckenstein at the Glenview Police Department.
