Program: SMART 911, Brett, Public Safety Dispatch Center

Consolidated Dispatch Centers

Village of Glenview and other 13 communities went in together and purchased SMART 911

2 locations (Glenview Village & Highland Park)-since 2014

Cohesiveness between communities

Collaborating saves taxpayer money (decreases cost for Village of Glenview; 15K to about 1K) 911 from landline yields an exact address

911 from cell phone, less precise- size of a football field

Trickiest when people are in distress and can't pinpoint where they are at

Rapid SOS is included (been around about 1.5 years)- shrinks precision from the football field down to the size of a parking lot.

You provide data and it gets entered into the Highly Secure database

You can provide as much or as little information into this system (e.g., address, who lives in home, emergency contacts, medical information, vehicle information, etc.)

Your information is accessible to them ONLY when you dial 911

Not a single violation/data breach in people's private information in 10+ years Registration takes about 5 minutes.

Can use through the web access, or can download app on your smartphone

Some communities have RAVE alert- Glenview does. It basically gives them access to give you information based on your location of your phone. (emergency information)

Availability of Rapid SOS gets access to all 911 calls - even if not registered with SMART SOS

Can communicate with SMART 911 via texting in emergencies when talking is not a good/viable option (e.g., allergic reaction, domestic violence situation, etc).
