Executive Director of Wesley Child Center (Glenview Businessman of the Year [©]):

Wesley is back in District 34 buildings delivering programming. Maintained all staff employment throughout the pandemic. Pre-school up and running as well.

Cathy Kedjidjian:

District 34 Director of Communications and Strategic Planning. Partnerships (FSC-D34

ParentConnect, parent education/support); Youth Services (in District 34 buildings), Wesley (in District 34 buildings); Gelfand Foundation (support, necessities closet, part of the GNN Glenview Necessities Network). A number of grants available. Office is open if anyone has any questions.
